

Index to *The Gallipolian*

The Gallipolian is the journal of The Gallipoli Association. It was first published in December 1969. Since then, three journals have been produced each year, in spring, summer and autumn.

The index lists most articles published in the journal, grouped by subject. Under each subject heading, articles are listed in order of their publication date. The author is named in round brackets. Clarifications from the compilers of the index are shown in square brackets. The issue number is shown last, in bold.

- Exceptions to this rule are book reviews, which are listed alphabetically by author; obituaries, listed alphabetically by the name of the deceased; and poems, listed alphabetically by title. The list of book reviews can be found at the end of the index, and not under B.
- County regiments afforded the title Royal are listed thus: Berkshire Regiment, Royal. Other regiments and corps afforded that honour, like the Royal Fusiliers, are indexed under R.
- Not every event and commemoration is listed, particularly if they are held annually. An event or commemoration is listed if it is the first occurrence, or of particular significance. Similarly, regular Association business, such as the Chairman's or Treasurer's Report, is not listed, unless significant.

Members can download all issues from www.gallipoli-association.org/journals. The following table will help you match the issue number with its year of publication.

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The index was originally compiled in 2007 by Robert Pike, then updated and expanded to 2015 by the journal editors, Foster Summerson and Bryn Dolan. Bernard de Broglie indexed issues from 2016 to 2022 and updated the layout. This version brings the index up to date and was produced by the GA's digital team.
